**SUNDAY, OCTOBER 7:** We will travel northwest today along scenic routes making regular meal and rest stops en route. Enjoy a visit to the **Grice Museum** in Clearfield, which offers a unique collection of over 70 antique and classic cars from the early 1900s to today's specialty cars, plus a large collection of African game mounts. Highlights include a 1925 Ford Motel T Truck and a 1963 Vette Split Window in the car collection, and in the game section, a moose with evidence of its encounter with Canadian phone lines (still wrapped around the rack!), African Lion, elephant tusks and a Grand Slam (Sheep) including a Dahl Ram, Big Horn Ram, Stone Ram and Dessert Ram. The onsite gift shop includes 75 model airplanes suspended from the ceiling. We will drive a short distance to **Flickerwood Wine Cellars** in Kane, known as the "Wine that Rocks," for a wine tasting followed by a delicious dinner. **MONDAY, OCTOBER 8:** Following breakfast at the hotel, we will travel to Jamestown, New York, where we will enjoy a full day of Lucy! First, we will visit the **Lucy Desi Museum & Center for Comedy** featuring the **Desilu Studios and The Lucille Ball Desi Arnaz Museum**. For decades, Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz played a vital role in television and on the big screen, and their legacy is proudly honored in Lucy's hometown of Jamestown. The Desilu Studios is devoted to the "I Love Lucy" TV series and includes exact replicas of sets from the show, an interactive Vitameatavegamin set, a screening area, and showcases filled with vintage memorabilia as well as costumes that were worn on the show. Desilu Studios is the permanent home of the "I Love Lucy" 50th Anniversary Tour Sets that traveled the country in 2001-2002 to celebrate the most popular show ever on television. The museum provides an intimate look into the lives of the first couple of comedy and displays



items of Lucy and Desi's including priceless costumes, awards, photographs, and other vintage memorabilia. A small theatre offers screenings including excerpts from Lucie Arnaz's Emmy Award-winning documentary "Lucy & Desi: A Home Movie" and historic TV episodes, plus there are episodes playing throughout the museum as part of the various displays. Enjoy time for lunch on own in downtown Jamestown. Then, embark on a **guided driving tour of Jamestown** highlighting Lucy landmarks. You'll see the homes where Lucy was born and grew up, theaters where she performed, places where she attended school, the cemetery where she is buried with her family, and more. The town also honors "America's Favorite Redhead" with five larger-than-life murals painted by local artist Gary Peters. Visit the **Reg Lenna Center for the Arts, formerly the Palace Theatre** where Lucille Ball and her grandfather Fred Hunt used to watch vaudeville and where she performed as a teen. This is also where the movie *Forever Darling* premiered which both Lucy and Desi attended. Learn about the theatre's history and renovation as well as a chance to go onto the main stage. Then, relax on a **sightseeing cruise** on beautiful Chautauqua Lake aboard the *Summer Wind*, a yacht-type cruise with complete historical narration, departing from the Lucille Ball Memorial Park. This evening, "Eat Like Lucy" in the unique setting and beautiful atmosphere of the **Tropicana Room**, a reproduction of Ricky Ricardo's famous Manhattan night club, located in the upper level of the Desilu Studios.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 9: We will depart the hotel after breakfast for a visit to the **Old Jail Museum**, Pennsylvania's sixth most haunted place, in Smethport. The museum showcases the history of McKean County with historical displays and perhaps visit the dungeon which some say is haunted. Afterwards, embark on a short **driving tour of Smethport** to include the historic Mansion District. Lunch will be on your own at the **Barrel House Restaurant** in Lantz Corners, PA. This afternoon, we will visit the **Kinzua Gorge**, just outside of Mount Jewett, to enjoy spectacular views from the site's glass-bottomed skywalk which extends 600 feet over and 230 feet above the bottom of the gorge. Once the world's longest, highest railroad bridge, this gorge was the home to the Kinzua Viaduct, built in 1882 as a railroad bridge to span the 2,053-foot wide gorge. An engineering marvel at the time it was built, it was known as the 8th man-made wonder. After a tornado destroyed a portion of the structure the skywalk was built on the remaining supports honoring the bridge's history while creating a new scenic landmark. **Kinzua Sky Walk** offers a unique glimpse into the bridge's history revealing the ingenuity, dedication and determination of its designers and builders. The visitors center features historical displays highlighting the age of engineering marvels and an introductory video. We will then visit the **Zippo Visitors Center** in Bradford which is "truly enlightening." Committed to the craft and quality synonymous with "Made in America," the site's unique museum showcases the history of two American icons, the Zippo lighter and the Case knife. Explore the 15,000 square foot attraction that includes the world famous Zippo repair Clinic and Zippo/Case flagship store.



Fourteen custom-made Zippo street lighters line the drive leading up to the building. Over the entrance towers a 40-foot Zippo lighter with pulsating neon flame and an enormous Case Canoe three-blade pocket knife. Enjoy a variety of historical and quirky displays including a 7x11 American flag comprised of 3,393 red, white and blue lighters. Have time to relax at the hotel before enjoying a buffet dinner at **Beefeater's Downtown Eatery**, formerly a library funded by Andrew Carnegie, and now a unique restaurant in Bradford.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 10: After checking out of the hotel this morning, we will visit the **Pennsylvania Lumber Museum** in Galeton which tells the story of PA's rich lumbering history and promotes the ongoing care, management, and recreational use of its forests. The museum

exhibits feature thousands of objects ranging from prehistoric stone tools to early chain saws. Interactive exhibits simulate chopping and sawing a tree, piloting a log raft and racing locomotives. The historic recreated logging camp on the 160-acre museum property includes a 70-ton Shay locomotive and 1910 Barnhart log loader. Then, we will visit **Patterson Farms Maple Products** where the Patterson family has been collecting and processing maple syrup for five generations. Tour the sugar house operation where you will learn the history of making maple syrup from the Indians to the present day and enjoy a sit down tasting of some of their delicious products. We will travel home with dinner and shopping planned en route at the **Country Cupboard Restaurant** in Lewisburg, PA to complete this unique autumn tour!
