- 10:00-1:00 - Self-guided visit at the **BRAND NEW Museum of the American Revolution** – The Museum of the American Revolution opened its doors to the public on April 19, 2017—the anniversary of “the shot heard ‘round the world.” Over one hundred years in the making, the Museum explores the dynamic story of the American Revolution using our expansive collection of Revolutionary-era weapons, personal items, documents, and works of art. Immersive galleries, theater experiences, and recreated historical moments bring to life the events, people, and ideals of our nation’s founding and engage people in the history and continuing relevance of the American Revolution. From the early stirrings of unrest in Boston to the opening shots of the War of Independence, and from signing of the Declaration of Independence to the creation of the American Republic, the Museum’s permanent exhibition explores the ideas, events, and legacies of America's Revolutionary beginnings.
- 1:15-2:45 - **Lunch at City Tavern Restaurant** – Experience authentic 18th century American culinary history as you dine at the historic City Tavern Restaurant, established in 1773, and currently owned by renowned chef, Walter Staib. Called “the most genteel tavern in America” by John Adams, City Tavern was the location of the first Fourth of July celebration in 1777, as well as George Washington's Pre-Inaugural Ball. Please pre-select from one of the following entree choices:
- 1) Fillet of salmon with Béarnaise sauce
 - 2) Medallions of beef with burgundy demi glace
 - 3) Boneless breast of chicken with madeira sauce
- Entrees served with tavern country salad, mashed potatoes, seasonal vegetables, dessert, coffee & hot tea.
- 3:00-5:00 -.Self-guided visit at the **National Constitution Center** – The first and only institution in America established by Congress to "disseminate information about the United States Constitution on a nonpartisan basis in order to increase the awareness and understanding of the Constitution among the American people." The Constitution Center brings the U.S. Constitution to life by featuring hundreds of interactive exhibits, engaging
